## Trilateral Meeting 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2016

Dear All,

As previously requested, we received your positive feedback for your personal participation in the upcoming Trilateral Czech-German-Polish Nephrology meeting in Dresden. The fixed date will be October 21-22, 2016.

With this letter, we would like to propose a novel design of this meeting in order to both, focus on future collaborative interactions of junior and senior physicians and scientists as well as a forum for clinical fellows and basic scientists. Please read carefully and get back to us, if you still have more questions regarding the structure, content and course of the upcoming trilateral meeting in Dresden.

**Our concept will start with 2 separate tracks on Friday:**

**Track 1: *Factoring new collaborations*** (for senior researchers)

We will try to develop and design collaborative projects in an innovative 3 step procedure.

**DIE DEUTSCHEN

a) In the first 2 hours, every senior researcher will provide a 5-minute introductory talk, focusing on methods/techniques/special interests/ideas he would like to bring into collaboration. Every presenter will have to stick to 5 minutes, we suggest using not more than 10 slides. The presentations will run automatically, no matter how many slides were provided (5 min/10 slides = 30 sec per slide; 5 min/20 slides = 15 sec per slide). So, please keep in time and stay very focused.

b) In a second 2 hours session, we will have 5-minute face-to-face sessions – you could also call it scientific blind-dating. Every researcher pair will have the chance for a 5 minute interaction, strongly focused on their personal interaction and overlap of scientific interest. This time should be used to generate/plot on a single sheet of paper, an idea of general interest. After 5 minutes, partners will change.

c) In the third 2 hours session, we will review proposals/ideas generated in session 2. Everyone will have to take a look on generated plots, we will try to match and collect them and finally try to further develop the best 5 ideas, remaining after a final voting.

**Track 2: “Implementing scientific interest”** (for clinical fellows and younger scientists)

*a) Planning and designing studies*

In close interaction with an experienced researcher and biometry expert, we will discuss the HowTo of clinical and experimental study planning and gather a closer look into numbers, sample sizes and appropriate methods. This will be of great help for session b).

*b) HowTo read a paper*

Clinicians and basic researchers will receive one clinical and one basic science paper prior to the meeting. Both papers will be read, analyzed and questioned by an experienced clinician and basic scientist.

*c) Up to Date Approaches and Methods*

Current scientific approaches and methods will be presented and **we would be glad to provide insight into techniques requested by participants. So please tell us, if there is something you are highly interested in and together we can find the best presenter.**

**On Saturday, we will have one single track.**

We will start with a **Nephropathology Quiz**, together with Prof. Kerstin Amann, Erlangen, Germany, as a highly renowned expert in the field.

This will be followed by a session entitled **“Science bridging technology, industry and biology”**, providing insights into the value of interactions with partners from outside the clinical surrounding. **We would be glad you would also provide suggestions on topics and presenters that would fit here to introduce ways to establish structures, report experiences and insights into the development of this important step between academic research and industry.**

**This will be followed by two sessions serving as young investigator forum.**

We would kindly request **abstracts** for this form, presenting recent scientific work. All abstracts will be presented as focused talks followed by a short discussion.

As pointed out by this letter, for this meeting with a completely different and novel approach, we urgently need all of you, your help and enthusiasm to make this a really interactive and successful meeting, so at the end we may have established collaborations regarding certain techniques or concrete studies as well as provided excellent training for young basic or clinical scientists. Let's try this out!
